

Elizabeth Bunn

Elizabeth Bunn was elected secretary-treasurer of the UAW at the UAW's 33d Constitutional Convention held in June 2002, the highest post held by a woman in UAW history. As secretary-treasurer, Ms. Bunn is the chief financial officer of the UAW.

At the bargaining table, Bunn has been a leader of negotiating teams that have achieved many collective bargaining breakthroughs. Highlights include innovative programs for families including child and elder care referral services, parental leaves for school events, and the creation of sick banks which allow workers to share leave time with other workers facing family emergencies; improved pay equity protections for state workers in Michigan; and joint training and health and safety programs modeled on the UAW's Big 3 contracts for public sector workers. She has also been an outspoken advocate for service workers on a broad range of public policy issues.

Bunn holds a BA from the University of Michigan and a JD from the Wayne State University Law School.
